Lessons Learned.....

On 9/15/17 a group of teachers from KRKM attended the NCAEYC's 64th Annual Conference. This opportunity for professional development in early childhood education brought together a diverse group of educators and provided a wide range of topics for our staff. In addition to learning new and innovative ways of educating young children, teachers came back from this day of training validated in their chosen profession, reflective of the experiences of others, and energized to share what they had learned. At our monthly staff meeting each of us shared important points. Trainings topics varied: classroom management through building relationships, process vs. product art, yoga in the classroom, gardening with children, language and literacy, fine motor development, and how personal reflection can improve teaching. Many of these workshops shared three main points. First, positive relationships are key to a successful classroom. Second, each child's learning style, personality and temperament are unique and must be considered in order to be effective as a teacher. Third, teachers must engage the whole brain for optimal learning - music, movement and activities that use all the senses allow maximum alertness, focus and memory. We also heard from two incredible educators. Enrique Feldman spoke about finding inspiration from within and showed us fantastic brain games! Michael Bonner (who was featured on "Ellen" for his incredible work at his Title 1 school in Eastern NC) was also very inspirational. He shared this quote, "Students do not care how much you know, until they know how much you care". Having the opportunity to participate in this conference provided a rewarding reminder to all of us of just how important our profession truly is.
